Color Me Local is Ina Bukva's senior project and her first big step into becoming a successful freelance artist. Her 32 page family coloring book is made for all ages and will feature Adirondack wildlife and scenery. The illustrations are all hand drawn with pencil and ink. Ina wanted her senior project to be art based, but also wanted to find a way to give back to the community that has supported her from the beginning of her career as an artist.

Ina plans to release approximately 150-200 copies of her book. Copies will be donated to the high school and elementary school art departments and to residents of Uihlein and the Saranac Village at Will Rogers. The remaining copies will be sold locally and online. The proceeds will go toward her college tuition at the New Hampshire Institute of Art.

The publishing fee is about \$250.00, and she is asking for contributions to the project through a GoFundMe page. Her goal is to be funded by June 9th.
