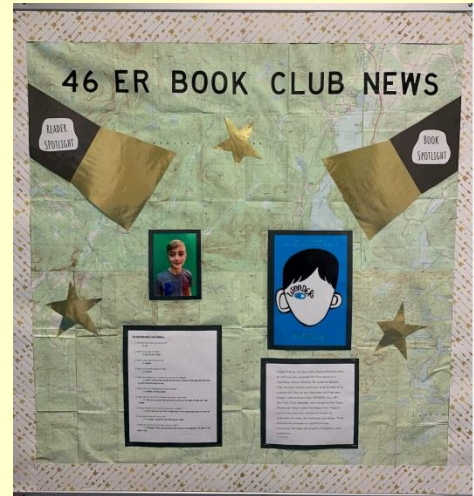
Principal's News

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Dear Parents

Reminder - If your child is absent be sure to contact the office. We will need to know the reason for the illness. As per protocols - if a child is absent for COVID related symptoms they will be required to follow the three step process before returning. A multiple day absence without an excuse will be considered as having COVID related symptoms.

Three things must happen before an individual is allowed to return to school:
1- The individual must be evaluated by a healthcare provider with appropriate documentation;
2- The individual must be tested for COVID-19 and provide documentation of a negative result;
3- The individual's symptoms must be clearing up.

Don't forget to report on your child's health condition weekly using [the link](#) or paper copy to the office.

It's getting chilly out. Be sure children are dressed to be outside. We go outside for recess as well as during many class times even as the weather turns so children need to be prepared for cooler temperatures, rain and even snow.
