Dear Parents

Reminder - If your child is absent be sure to contact the office. We will need to know the reason for the illness. As per protocols - if a child is absent for COVID related symptoms they will be required to follow the three step process before returning. A multiple day absence without an excuse will be considered as having COVID related symptoms.

Three things must happen before an individual is allowed to return to school:

- 1- The individual must be evaluated by a healthcare provider with appropriate documentation;
- 2- The individual must be tested for COVID-19 and provide documentation of a negative result;
- 3- The individual's symptoms must be clearing up.
