We will continue to monitor our school community's health. If your child is demonstrating any COVID symptoms, we recommend getting them tested and let our nurse know by emailing her at estosiek@lakeplacidcsd.net or by calling the main office.

A reminder that in order for your child to go remote you must contact the principal to make these arrangements. Due to the amount of preparation needed to succeed, remote learning begins on Mondays and lasts a minimum of two weeks.

Please remember to have your child follow all safety protocols; wearing a mask, social distancing and washing hands continues to be our best defense. Together we can help to stop the community spread.

Dear Parents

Reminder - If your child is absent be sure to contact the office. We will need to know the reason for the illness. As per protocols - if a child is absent for COVID related symptoms they will be required to follow the three step process before returning. A multiple day absence without an excuse will be considered as having COVID related symptoms.

Three things must happen before an individual is allowed to return to school:

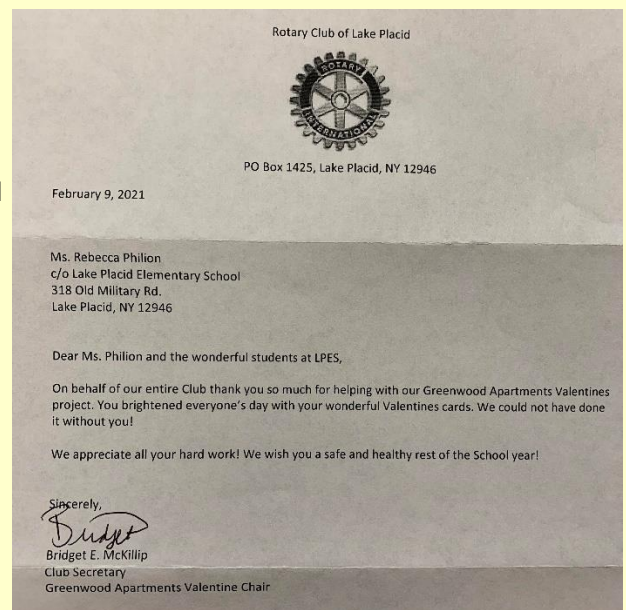
- 1- The individual must be evaluated by a healthcare provider with appropriate documentation;

- 3- The individual's symptoms must be clearing up.

Bomber Day is coming in March!

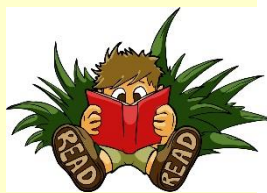

LPES Read Across America ~ March 2021

Theme - We are All Unique

Each student will write (or draw) what makes them unique on a star (classroom teachers; check your mailbox). The stars will be hung in the hallway near each classroom. Mrs. Haney will be sharing *Mixed: A Colorful Story* with all grade levels during Library to promote uniqueness and diversity.

Grade Level Reading Goal- Reading in School

Each grade level team is asked to set a realistic goal for students.

For example, first grade only has 24 students, their goal might be 20 minutes each day per student, and 20 school days in March, which would be 9,600 minutes. Fifth grade has 47 students, and they read for 30 minutes daily, then their goal might be 28,200 minutes.

If grade levels meet their individual challenge, they will receive extra recess (go outside at 2pm) on a nice spring day.

Note: If you do a read aloud for 10 minutes and you have 12 students, it counts as 120 minutes!

School-Wide Goal

We will keep track of our minutes by turning them into miles on a large USA map in the foyer.

This year, we have asked the senior class to submit read aloud videos to share with our students. It is a way for seniors to share their favorite picture books with other students, and show that reading is cool! Links will be sent to all.
